

## **PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE POLICY**

#### Section 1 - Purpose and Scope

- (1) Professional Experience placement is a compulsory requirement of all Initial Teacher Education courses.
- (2) The purpose of this Policy is to set out the parameters for Professional Experience placements including the commitments of the College and the requirements for students.

#### Scope

- (3) This Policy applies to:
  - a. all students undertaking an Initial Teacher Education course;
  - b. School Supervising Teachers of students undertaking professional experience; and
  - c. College staff.

#### Section 2 - Definitions

- (4) In this Policy:
  - a. **ACPE or College** means ACPE Ltd operating under the name Australian College of Physical Education.
  - b. AITSL means the Australian Institute for Teaching and School Leadership.
  - c. **ITE** means an Initial Teacher Education course. ITE courses at the College include the Bachelor of Education (Physical and Health Education) (BEd (PHE)) and the Bachelor of Dance Education (BDanEd).
  - d. **NSW Education Standards Authority (NESA)** oversees the regulation of schools in NSW and accredits Initial Teacher Education courses in NSW.
  - e. **Professional Experience** means the 'on-the-job' preparation for teaching undertaken by a student in a school by way of a placement.
  - f. **School Supervising Teacher** means the classroom teacher assigned as mentor teacher for the teacher education student during the placement.
  - g. **Student** means a teacher education student (that is, a student studying an Initial Teacher Education course at the College and undertaking a Professional Experience program).

#### Section 3 - Policy Statement

- (5) The College is committed to delivering a Professional Experience program that:
  - a. Meets the regulatory requirements of the NSW Education Standards Authority (NESA) for accredited ITE courses.
  - b. Complies with the NESA <u>Professional Experience in Initial Teacher Education</u> <u>policy</u>.



- c. Forms an integral and interrelated component of the ITE courses, based on informed theory and reflective practice.
- d. Provides a range of opportunities and experiences for students to develop the knowledge, skills, values and attitudes that are necessary for them to demonstrate achievement of the AITSL Australian Professional Standards for Teachers at the Graduate Teacher level.
- e. Provides opportunities to develop effective and sustainable partnerships with host schools, allowing for collaboration and sharing of knowledge and expertise.
- (6) Students undertaking a Professional Experience placement:
  - a. will be given a clear explanation of the expectations and learning outcomes of the Professional Experience placement;
  - b. are required to comply with standards of professional behaviour, reasonable directions from the host school and the College's Student Code of Conduct at all times while participating in the placement;
  - c. are required to satisfactorily complete all mandated authorisations and prerequisite units prior to undertaking the relevant Professional Experience placement; and
  - d. are expected to be adequately supervised while participating in a Professional Experience placement.
- (7) Students are responsible for their own costs associated with any Professional Experience placement.
- (8) Professional Experience placements 1 3 are to be undertaken as unpaid placements. The final placement (placement 4) may be undertaken as a partial paid placement subject to meeting NESA's policy requirements and approval by the College.
- (9) The College reserves the right not to place a student in a professional experience setting where the performance, personal or professional, conduct of the student does not meet the required standard.
- (10) The College reserves the right to withdraw a student from a Professional Experience placement at any time based on the grounds outlined in the Professional Experience Procedure.
- (11) Students may appeal against an academic decision made under this Policy or Procedure following the Grievances, Complaints and Appeals Policy and Procedure.

#### Public liability arrangements

(12) Students undertaking Professional Experience placements pursuant to this Policy are covered by the College's public liability and accident insurance policies.



(13) Host schools may request a copy of the current Certificate of Currency from the College.
